

The Matter of Estate of John Rogers deceased.

Be it remembered that on the 6th May 1845 comes into the office of the Clerk of the Allen Probate Court John Rogers and John Brown and pray that letters testamentary on the estate of the said John Rogers deceased late of Allen County, Indiana be granted unto them since the said Clerk being satisfied that said John Rogers had been deceased more than fifteen days last past & the said John Rogers having filed bond in the formal sum of six hundred dollars with John Fairfield as his security & the said John Brown having also filed bond in like sum with John Fairfield as his security & said John Rogers & Brown having filed their respective oaths as such executors in their words (to) Letters testamentary were issued as follows viz

I Philip G. Jones Clerk of the Probate Court in & for the County of Allen in the State of Indiana do certify the annexed to be a true copy of the last will and testament of John Rogers late of Allen County, Indiana deceased and John Rogers & John Brown having duly qualified & given separate oaths as required by law, and executors are duly authorized to take upon themselves the administration of said estate according to such will without appeal & the seal of said Court this 6th day of May in the year of our Lord 1845 P. G. Jones, Clk

The Matter of Estate of William Sawyer deceased!

Be it remembered that on the 2nd of June 1845 Robert Armstrong comes into Clerk's office files therein the last will & testament of said William Sawyer late of Allen County, Indiana deceased by which will it appears that one William Armstrong is executor of the said will and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Clerk of the Allen Probate Court that the person named in said will as executor was the said Robert Armstrong instead of William Armstrong & said Clerk also being satisfied that the said Robert Armstrong has been deceased more than thirty days last past & said Robert Armstrong having filed bond in the formal sum of One thousand dollars with Samuel Adams as his security which bond & oaths is approved of by the Clerk of said Court & also filed an oath or affirmation as such administrator Letters testamentary were issued in these words viz

I Philip G. Jones Clerk of the Probate Court in & for the County of Allen in the State of Indiana do certify the annexed to be a true copy of the last will & testament of William Sawyer late of Allen County in the State of Indiana deceased and of the entitlement of Probate enclosed therein since Robert Armstrong having duly qualified & given bond as required by law as administrator with the will annexed he is duly authorized to take upon himself the administration of said estate according to said will Without my being & the seal of said Court this 2nd of June 1845 P. G. Jones, Clk
