The matter of the Estate of Frederick Fulk Decedent
 Comes into the office of the Clerk of the Allen Probate Court
 Frederick Fulk applies in said office the appointment of administration
 on estate of said decedent by the name of said deceased I have found
 that letters of administration on said Estate of Frederick Fulk (a gentleman
 and the Clerk being satisfied that said Frederick Fulk has been dead
 for more than fifteen days last past & the said Frederick Fulk having filed
 bond in the penal sum of seven thousand dollars with William Hamilton
 as his security, which bond & security are approved of by the Clerk and
 having filed an oath which is in these words (his) Letters of administra-
 tion were issued in these words

I Robert E. Fleming Clerk of the Probate
 Court in & for the County of Allen in the State of Indiana do hereby certify
 that administration of the goods chattels rights credits moneys & effects which were
 of Frederick Fulk late of Allen County deceased who died intestate is granted
 to Frederick Fulk and the said Frederick Fulk having qualified & given bond
 as such administration is duly authorized to take upon himself the adminis-
 tration of such estate according to law

The Matter of the Estate of Lyman B. Bellamy Decd

Comes Caroline W. Bellamy widow of said

 the Clerk of the Probate Court in & for the County of Allen & State of Indiana, and
 having filed an oath as such administrator in these words (his) letters were

 of Allen in the State of Indiana do hereby certify that administration of the goods
 rights chattels credits moneys & effects which were of Lyman B. Bellamy late of Allen
 County deceased who died intestate, is granted to Caroline W. Bellamy and the said
 Caroline having qualified & given bond as such administrator is duly authorized
 to take upon herself the administration of such estate according to law
