INFLUENZA ORDINANCE AND MAYOR'S PROCLAMATION

Proclamation by the Mayor of the City of Fort Wayne, Indiana

Of the passage and taking effect of ordinance of said city for the protection of the public health and for the prevention and suppression of influenza.

WHEREAS, there is now prevalent throughout the city of Fort Wayne, Indiana, a serious epidemic of influenza endangering the health and lives of the inhabitants of said city; which epidemic has already cost the lives of

many of the citizens, and may, unless strict quarantine regulations are put in force and public gatherings prevented or limited, kill hundreds more; and,

WHEREAS, the Common Council of said city in special session assembled at the council chamber in the city _ hall on the evening of December 14, 1918, in order to suppress and check said epidemic, did, by unanimous

vote of the fourteen members of said council there present, out of the fifteen members elect of said council, pass General Ordinance of said city No. 865 as amended, entitled: "An ordinance for the protection of the public health of the city of Fort Wayne, and for the prevention and suppression of the disease of influenza," which said ordinance is in words and in figures, as follows, to with

AND, WHEREAS, an urgent necessity requires the immediate operation of this ordinance for the protection of the public health of said city and the prevention and suppression of said epidemic of influenza, as delay may result in the needless loss of many lives, which said urgent necessity has been determined by the Common Council in said ordinance,

NOW, THEREFORE, 1, W. Sherman Cutshall, mayor of the said city of Fort Wayne, by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the laws of the state of Indiana, do hereby publicly proclaim that the above and foregoing General Ordinance No. 865 as amended, of said city shall take effect from and after the date of this proclamation after copies of

said ordinance and proclamstion shall have been posted in three (3) public places in each of the wards of said city.
